Sports News

As the wind gusted at speeds of up to 40mph and the rain lashed down at Old Woking's Cricket ground, our year 5 cricket team entered battle in the District Kwik cricket tournament. Many of Goldsworth's team have had much experience of cricket both at club and playground level so hopes were riding high as play began.

We first played Horsell and struggled to get our batting arms going as their bowlers displayed great flare and guile with every delivery. We posted a total which required beating, but was a reasonably easy target unless many wickets were taken. As Goldsworth took to the field they knew the hard work that must be done and battled hard to keep Horsell's run rate as low as possible, the wides to a minimum, have safe hands in the field and to take a few wickets. Ultimately, Horsell were able to bat their way to convincing victory. After a solid team talk, Goldsworth re-grouped and batted, bowled and fielded brilliantly to defeat Sythwood. In their final group match, there was now everything to play for. If Goldsworth were to overcome the might of Pyrford (who had already beaten Horsell), there would be three teams tied on 2 wins and a loss and run rate would decide who would progress to the semi-finals. In an epic display of team cricket, Goldsworth batted with precision and timing, hitting many boundaries and losing few wickets to post an incredibly respectable total of 257. In the field catches were held, our bowlers once again found their aim and fielding brilliance saw run-outs aplenty.
